ATCA TROPHY

For those of you who live here with us in Minnesota, the State of Hockey, you can appreciate the similarities between The Airedale Bowl, the most prestigious award of the Airedale Terrier Club of America, and Lord Stanley's Cup, the top prize of the National Hockey League.



A perpetual trophy, it has been in continuous competition since 1910 (with the exceptions of 1943, 1944, 1945, and 1946) and was valued 13 years ago, in 2010, in excess of \$38,000. The Airedale Bowl is awarded at the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Airedale Terrier Club of America to the Best of Breed Winner at ATCA Specialty shows. To commemorate the win, the names of the winning Airedale and its owners are engraved on silver plates around the base of the Bowl.

As the base fills, new layers are added. Today, the trophy stands nearly 6 feet.

Originally, the Bowl was on display at all ATCA Specialty shows. However, due to the damage incurred during shipping, the Board of Directors decided that the Bowl would only be allowed to travel to Specialty shows via land transportation and in the direct possession of an ATCA Board member or trophy chairperson. New airline-approved travel containers were made in 2000 for the Bowl, and it can again travel by air, although the preferred method is still land transport.

If you have never seen the Bowl in person, the TCATC encourages you to take the opportunity to do so during the Floater. It is a living historical record of the top Airedales since 1910.

JUDGES 2023 ATCA FLOATER



Anne got her first Airedale in 1980 and is an active owner and breeder under the Spindletop banner. She has competed with her Airedales in Conformation, Agility, Coursing Ability, FastCAT, Scent Work, Trick Dog and Barn Hunt. Anne began judging Airedales in 2000. She judged the ATCA 2007 Floater in Ohio and the national specialty at Montgomery in 2015. She is approved to judge the Terrier and Hound groups and a third of the Sporting group. Along with the ATCA, Anne's memberships include the Bell County Kennel Club and North Texas Barn Hunters. Anne, a Baylor grad, owns and operates Countryside Pet Resort in Georgetown, Texas.

Jean has been a member of the ATCA since 1983 and has shown Airedales in conformation under the "Darbywood" prefix since 1984. Though her first Airedale earned an obedience title, her focus in Airedales is conformation and breeding. Jean's first homebred champion was CH Darbywood's Eye of the Tiger, one of the top-producing dams in breed history with 20 conformation champions to her credit. Darbywood has bred more than 50 conformation champions, including International and Grand Champions and several obedience champions. Jean is a 20+ year member of the Wisconsin Airedale Terrier Club and has been a member of her local all-breed club, Badger Kennel Club, since 1982.

Floater Obedience/Rally Judge Karen J. Anderson



All of Karen's life, she has trained dogs. She also raised, trained, and showed horses for years. At age 9, Karen was mentored by a neighbor who competed in obedience. Thus began more than 25 years of training, showing, and judging obedience. Karen has trained and competed with several other breeds, including a Doberman and an Airedale, but in the 1980s, she acquired another Dobe and has had them ever since. Her dogs have earned many UD, HIT, HC RAE, and Scent Work titles in Canada. Karen's Dobes were honored as finalists in the Doberman Pinscher Club of America Top 20 Obedience.

JUDGES 2023 TCATC DESIGNATED



Involved with purebred dogs most of his life, Richard started with English Cocker Spaniels before breeding and showing English Setters in his native England. His desire to exhibit and breed terriers took him to California to work for top handlers before establishing a kennel and small farm he and his wife, Sue, bought in Palmyra, Penn. Of the many terriers bred and shown, perhaps the best known were the Flatford and Hapitails Welsh terriers co-owned with the late Elizabeth Leaman. Richard has judged several national terrier specialties and taken various assignments in England, Europe, and South America. He is approved to judge the Terrier, Sporting, and Toy groups, several Working and Hound breeds, and Best in Show.

Rhae grew up with Dachshunds and switched to Airedale Terriers in the 1990s when she acquired Airedale Fairewood Arbutus Tiger (Arby). She jumped cluelessly into dog showing guided by professional handler Raymond Yurick, who showed Arby at 9 months to 'Best Puppy in Show' and a Group 2 on her first weekend out. In 1994, Rhae moved to Lincoln, Neb., where they established the Fyrebrick kennel and began breeding and showing. She's been a member of many dog clubs over time and a sweepstakes judge including TCATC in 2012. She's pleased to return to TCATC for the ATCA 2023 Floater.

HUNT JUDGES 2023 FLOATER WEEKEND

Susan, Menomonee Falls, Wisc., has been an AKC Spaniel Hunt Test Judge for many years. She judged for the ATCA Great Lake Floater Hunt Test in 2008 and for the ATCA Cooley Hunt Test in 2015. She and her husband, Bob, also an AKC Hunt Test Judge, often bring their English Cocker and Irish Water Spaniels to participate in our Cooley Hunt Tests. Susan and Bob were both very helpful during the application process when the ATCA was working on getting Airedales into AKC Spaniel Hunting Tests and on gaining TCATC's own license to hold those tests. This weekend, she marks history as Airedales hold the first All Airedale Hunt Test.

Dean, Shakopee, Minn., has been an AKC Spaniel Hunt Test Judge for many years. He was a judge at a Shiocton, Wisc., hunt test in 2009, the second hunt test that was possible for Airedales to enter, and seven Airedales entered. Many earned their first hunt test ribbons at that test. Dean, a Minnesota resident, and long-time Minnesota Hunting Spaniel Association member, makes himself available to train and has judged in tests where Airedales competed. Dean holds a distinguished place in history as a judge in this inaugural AKC All Airedale Hunt Test.

FIELD, WATER, FUR

Of course, you want a spiffy dog. But it must also be good at upland hunting, retrieving, and fur tracking.

So how did the Airedale Terrier, originally a lowly hunter of rats and other vermin in the 1800s, rise from the most popular dog in the 1920s to the poster child of sass and class in the 1980s? Well, the application of the dog is the foundation of its breeding. First a hunter, the Airedale Terrier became so popular in the 1920s that some thought they were mean. Mothers warned, "You watch out for those dooly dogs!" After a time of decreasing attention, in the 1980s, Linda Ronstadt was posing with a pair of Airedales depicting a jetsetting Lush Life on the cover of her album recorded with Nelson Riddle. The Airedale made a valuable statement to people who remembered the classics and the 'dales that went with them. Depicted with Miss Linda made them spiffy.

Enter hunting enthusiasts who were aware of the Airedales' foundation. A bit of research led to more research and discussions among those enthusiasts.

Names such as Dave Morgan, Randy Cooley, Karen Copley, and Scott Lichty figure into the path that has been more than 20 years in the making.

At the 2023 AKC Floater Banquet, Scott Lichty will share the history and future of the ATCA Hunting and Field Committee. This hunting competition makes history as the inaugural all-Airedale AKC hunt test in the U.S.






Restaurants in driving distance to hotel

YELLOW

SEMI - URGENT

- Vomiting (2 or fewer episodes)
- Acute diarrhea without vomiting

- Witnessed ingestion of foreign body with no signs of illness
- Blood in urine/straining to urinate in a dog or female cat
- Small wounds or lacerations
- Non-productive cough but breathing fine otherwise
- Broken toenails
- Squinting/eye discharge/ significantly swollen eye Allergic reactions (facial
- swelling, hives)
- Limping
- Witnessed ingestion of rat bait
- Mild trauma/single injury

GREEN

NON - URGENT

- Itching/Scratching
- Chronic weight loss
- Chronic illnesses/diseases with no recent change in condition
- Hair loss
- Red eyes/skin/ears
- A single seizure with full recovery
